

In this presentation, Dr. Bouloux will discuss the common causes of office-based anesthesia morbidity and mortality. The top ten causes will be identified; and management strategies discussed to help the surgeon prevent, recognize and manage complications.

Additionally, a comprehensive approach to risk stratification of the medically compromised patient will be provided to ensure patients can be medically optimized across a broad range of systemic diseases including cardiac, pulmonary, renal, hepatic, endocrine and hematological disorders.

Featured Speaker



Gary F. Bouloux, DDS, MD

Dr. Bouloux obtained his dental degree from Sydney University in Australia in 1989. He completed a three-year GPR at Westmead Hospital; followed by his residency in OMFS finishing in 1996. Dr. Bouloux received a Masters of Dental Science and during his residency, completed a thesis on the toxicology of bupivacaine. He completed a two-year fellowship in TMJ and Orthognathic Surgery at Emory University in 1999 where he attended medical school, graduating in 2004. Following a one-year internship, he joined the Division of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Emory University in 2005 where he currently serves as Professor and Residency Program Director as well as Director of Clinical Research.

Dr. Bouloux's interests include the diagnosis and management of TMJ Disorders, metal hypersensitivity following total joint replacement, mandibular reconstruction and anesthesia. In 2017, he was awarded the AAOMS research recognition award for his research in TMD. He has over 30 peer reviewed manuscripts, 40 chapters and is an editor of a text book and serves on several AAOMS committees and is a member of the editorial Board of *JOMS*.
